## Lodging

The residence hall has 174 single-occupancy rooms. Each room is equipped with a queen-size bed, private bath, TV, WiFi, coffee pot, refrigerator, iron and ironing board, desk, storage area, and a telephone.

## Wellness

Our wellness center is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. It includes a weight room, cardio room, game room, basketball court, racquetball court, and sauna. Outside, there is a sports field, tennis court, and jogging trail.

To fulfill this mission, the Academy conducts a variety of education and training programs in health and safety and related subjects for Federal mine inspectors and other government, mining and industry personnel.




